


Figure 8. 1879 *Quan Tai qianhoushan yutue*. Source: Wei and Gao, *Chuanyue shikong kan Taipei*, 18. Red markings of walled cities added by Wei and Gao.

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


Figure 9. 1882 *North Formosa*. Source: Wei and Gao, *Chuanyue shikong kan Taipei*, 19.




Figure 10. 1896 *Taiwan Taibeicheng zhi tu*. Source Wei and Gao, *Chuanyue shikong kan*, 20.




Figure 11. December 1895 map, with labeling by author. Source: National Library, Taiwan Branch.




Figure 12. 1897 map, detail. Source: Tabeishi wenxianhui.




Figure 15. 1905 Planning Map: Source: National Library, Taiwan Branch.




Figure 18. 1911 *Saishin Taihokushi hikōki chōmoku zenzu*, detail of Northgate area.




Figure 24. 1935 Map of Taihoku, Detail of Taihoku Imperial University.




Figure 26. 1935 Map of Taihoku. Detail of Guanyin Mountain and the Coast.
